The marker is fashioned after the Southern Cross of Honor Medal. On the front of the marker are the dates 1861 and 1865 representing the beginning and end of the war. Also, DEO VINDICI, Latin for "Vindicated by God". On the back are the letters CSA for Confederate States of America. The markers are a way to honor the deceased soldiers' service in the war.

THOMAS BUTLER, ONE OF OUR PIONEERS: The attached information is included in a booklet about James and Winifred Brooks Butler written by W. Clanton Mosley and presented to the historical section of the Pintlala Public Library. FINDING ORIGINAL LAND GRANTS ON THE INTERNET: It is now much easier (and cheaper!) than it was formerly to get copies of original U. S. Government land grants! This is now handled by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The BLM Government Land Office (GLO) also has articles about other interesting items, such as the Wild Horse Adoption Programs. If I, a hopeless computer clutz, can find it, **ANYONE** can!

1. Open on "BLM-GLO".
2. Click on "Search Land Patents" at the top of the page on left.
3. Select:
 - a. State
 - b. Last name (Required)
 - c. First name (Helpful)then click on "Search."
4. If more than one are listed, you may have to look at several to make sure you get the one you want. Select the patentee name and issue date that seems most likely. (I marked the one I wanted for Thomas Butler file in Montgomery County with in asterisk.)
5. Select "View Image" to preview the document, this one is signed by President Andrew Jackson. I'm sure that real computer people could get at better image, but I never could. Then, you can click "Ad to Shopping Cart" and get a copy for only \$2.00! (I paid \$15.00 for the one I had ordered about 10 years ago.) If you decide to order, it's a good idea to print a confirmation copy of your order.

TIME LINE FOR THOMAS BUTLER

1784

October 9

Thomas Butler was born to James and Winifred Brooks Butler in Edgefield District., SC.

1806

January 16

Thomas Butler bought a bay colt for \$50.06 at the sale for the Estate of Anthony Butler.

1812

January 29

Thomas Butler was married in Edgefield Dist., SC, to Aletha Robey Barnes, a daughter of Henry Barnes and Anne Roby Lanham.

1818

?

Thomas Butler and Martha "Patsey" Butler Moseley with their families and others from Edgefield District, SC, settled in southwestern Montgomery Co., AL. Thomas settled on the "Baldy Arrington Place" opened a farm, and built a mill on Pintlala Creek. His place was used for elections, musterings, public meetings, horse races, etc. Butler Mill Road in southern Montgomery County runs by this area.

1845

October 15

Thomas Butler was married in Montgomery Co., AL, to his second wife Letitia Bussey Boyd, a daughter of Dempsey Bussey and Sarah Lyon and widow of Walter Boyd.

1853

June 15

Thomas Butler was named Executor to the Last Will and Testament of Alpheus G. Jones of Montgomery Co., AL, and Guardian of his children James A. Jones and Mary L. Jones.

1854

?

Thomas Butler died in Montgomery Co., AL. His grave near the crossing of Butler Mill and Union Academy Roads was marked with a millstone he brought from SC. Robert Boyd as named as the Executor of the Last Will and Testament of Thomas Butler.

?

An appraisement of the personal property of Thomas Butler included slaves (Nelly - old and of no value; men: Fedrick, Isaac and Wilbert; boys: Seus, John, Henry and William; women; Chainey with child Fedrick, Rachel with Joshua and Joseph, and Eveline), livestock (2 yokes of oxen, 5 horses, 30 head of cattle, 104 hogs, 13 sheep, 31 goats, 15 geese and 4 bee hives), farm implements (a horse wagon, an ox wagon, a log cart, a double tree, 20 plows and stocks, 1 lot of hoes and axes, 1 lot of bells, 2 cradles, a pair of shears and a curry comb, 1 saddle with saddle bags, and a crosscut saw), crops (peas, oats, fodder, butter and potato slips), household items (5 bedsteads, 4 tables, 3 chairs, a spinning wheel, a leaf board, crockery, glassware, fire dogs, tin pans, knives and forks, stone ware, and water vessels and trays), a shot gun with powder and shot, blacksmith tools, carpenter tools, 100 feet of walnut lumber, and a fan. December 26

The Estate Sale of the personal property of Thomas Butler was held.

1855

March 2

Robert Boyd submitted to Hugh W. Watson, Judge of Probate of Montgomery County, AL, an account of the Negro hire and land rent belonging to the Estate of Thomas Butler due on January 1, 1856, between the date of death of the deceased and the sale of the same. Negroes were hired to J. W. Bonham, L. G. Mathews, Robert Boyd and William S. Boyd. The plantation was rented to Thomas Norman and the mill to William S. Boyd.

November 2

Robert Boyd sold all the real estate of the Estate of Thomas Butler to Archibald N. Arrington for \$9320. The land was located in Sections 2, 11, 13, 14 and 23 in T13 R17 and Sections 11,12 and 13 in T12 R17. Samuel Arrington and William N. Rives were securities on a note of credit payable on January 1, 1857.

1857

March

Robert Boyd submitted an account of the final settlement of the Estate of Thomas Butler. Items included \$9320 for the sale of real estate, \$384.45 for Negro hire and land rent, \$8179.15 for the sale of perishable and personal property, and inventory notes of William J. Holiver, W. W. Watson, C. R. Waller, Brittan & Blue, William Parmer, G. W. Tarver, Elkanah Barnes, Elisha Tally, Margaret Jones, S. B. Johnston, James G. Turner, William D. Sankey, Cowles Woodruff & Co., E. A. & G. Cowles, M. Waller & Beottice, and Eaton Walton.

1864

April 20

Letitia Bussey (Boyd) Butler died in Montgomery County, AL. She was buried at the buried at Ekwurzel Family Cemetery, Montgomery County, AL. James A. Sellers was named Administrator of her estate. [Butler Estate Files LGM96 , Alabama Department of Archives and History]

November 18

The sale of the personal property of the Estate of Letitia Butler totaled \$14080.95 at Confederate prices.

1866

November 7

James A. Sellers petitioned David Campbell, Judge of Probate of Montgomery County, AL, for permission to sell the real estate of the Estate of Letitia Butler in order to make a fair and equitable division among the heirs. Heirs included her living children and the children of her deceased children by her marriage to Walter Boyd. This land consisted 340 acres in Sections 7 and 8 T13 R18.

1867

January 13

James A. Sellers sold the real estate of the Estate of Letitia Butler for a total of \$2629.

1869

December 21

James A. Sellers submitted the account of the final settlement of the Estate of Letitia Butler to George Ely, Judge of Probate of Montgomery County, AL. The estate totaled \$20304.07. Items included the sale of personal property, the sale of real estate, cash for sale of cotton, land rent, Negro hire, \$62.50 in gold and \$21.65 in silver.
