The cafeteria account was \$15,673.54, and disbursements were \$15,667.15, leaving a balance of \$6.39.

Fees amounted to \$2,322.92 and disbursements were \$965.258 leaving a balance of \$1,357.64.

Miss Louise Kelly of the school faculty is the sponsor and the Alabama National Bank is the depository.
